The first photo presents the apartment house in the riverside, Läntinen Rantakatu 21. This romantic functionalist house is designed by the Finnish architect Erik Bryggman and it was built at the turn of the 1940s and 1950s. Bryggman lived in this address for the last years of his life and also moved his office there.

The another photo has been taken from the other side of the Aura river, from Piispankatu, the street near the Turku Cathedral. The landscape of Piispankatu covers the residential, university and industrial construction of the 1800s and 1900s.





This old building is located in Žvėrynas. Almost all old houses in Žverynas are considered as Cultural heritage. In the end of XVIII and beggining of XIX century Žvėrynas was like a resort area for aristocrats. So that's why most of old houses in Žverynas are very sophisticated.





This modern masterpiece is located in the city center. This is the head office of "Swedbank" and there are 16 floors. The complex of the building consists of two higher interconnected buildings and a lower building which faces the river. Because of the blooming sakura, avenue near this building is the most popular place in Vilnius

During the planning and construction of the building there was a lot of controversy among the locals because people thought the architecture was too modern and that it clashed with the surrounding wooden buildings.
